



8,000 RELIEF PACKS DISTRIBUTED IN KAWIT: Thousands of locals from different barangays in Kawit received relief packs from the provincial government on August 6, 2019 as part of its quick response after the onslaught of heavy rains. Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla, together with Vice Governor Jolo Revilla, visited constituents and checked their situation while the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) facilitated the distribution. Recipients who were affected by habagat assembled at the covered courts of Samala Marquez and Rockwell Subdivision, all thankful for the blessings and messages of hope delivered to their communities by guests including 1st District Board Members Davey Chua and Rommel Enriquez, Vice Mayor Arman Bernal and municipal councilors. RESPONDING TO THE MEDICAL NEEDS OF TRECEÑOS: A total of 399 residents in Barangay Inocencio in Trece Martires City received free consultations and tooth extraction during the conduct of PGC's medical and dental mission on August 2, 2019. Volunteer doctors, dentists and other medical professionals from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital examined every patient to know their health problems and prescribed the corresponding medicines. Treceños were also given the opportunity to avail other services including random blood sugar testing by Multilab Diagnostic and Health Services, checking of weight and blood pressure, and family planning counselling conducted by employees from the Provincial Population Office. Barangay Captain Rosendo Dilidili, barangay health workers and other volunteers from the local and provincial government assisted in the event making it more organized and successful. DENGUE CONTROL AND PREVENTION: With more than 6,000 dengue cases in the entire province of Cavite, the Provincial Health Office in partnership with BASF Philippines, Inc. conducted mosquito misting at the Gen. Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital compound in Trece Martires City on August 3, 2019. Personnel from BASF Philippines, Inc. started mosquito misting around the vicinity of GEAMH early in the morning, an initiative which is part of their corporate social responsibility. RELIEF DISTRIBUTION IN CAVITE
Continuous rains brought by the southwest monsoon (habagat) and low pressure area (LPA) affected coastal communities and those living along rivers and creeks in the province of Cavite. In a prompt response, Governor Jonvic Remulla directed concerned offices, primarily the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) and the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) to assess the situation for the effective allocation of relief resources.
On August 5, 2019, Governor Remulla spearheaded the distribution of relief packs in Tanza and Trece Martires City with the team of volunteers from PSWDO and PDRRMO. The governor underscored that the program is intended to somehow help the families on their basic needs, since most of the livelihood are halted due to the bad weather condition. Likewise, Governor Remulla provided safety reminders which are very vital for their health during the rainy season amidst the dengue outbreak in the province.
In Trece Martires City, Mayor Gemma Lubigan, Vice Mayor Bobby Montehermoso and the city councilors joined the governor during the relief distribution program held at the South Summit covered court in Barangay Aguado for a total of 4,000 recipients.
Meanwhile, in Tanza, wherein most of the affected families are fisherfolks, relief goods were distributed at the covered courts of coastal barangays Julugan V and Amaya VII. Local officials headed by Mayor Yuri Pacumio and Vice Mayor Munding del Rosario together with the members of the Sangguniang Bayan thanked the provincial government for prioritizing their constituents during calamity situations. Four thousand packs were allotted for the consumption of barangays Julugan I-VIII, same with the relief goods received by the residents of Barangay Amaya.
The locals were also relieved with the presence of other guests including Congressman Boying Remulla, Vice Governor Jolo Revilla, Board Members Ping Remulla and Lito Langit who also told recipients to stay dry and stay safe.
Other coastal municipalities such as Kawit and Naic are next to visit for donation of relief.
