



ENHANCING TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SKILLS OF BARANGAY TANOD: Following the training on maintaining peace and order in the community, the provincial government of Cavite led by Governor Jonvic Remulla continue to capacitate Barangay Tanods, this time on effective traffic management. On November 6, 2019, another Basic Traffic Management Seminar was conducted by the provincial government's Road Safety Division for the benefit of the Barangay Tanods in the municipalities of Carmona, Silang and General Mariano Alvarez. They were oriented on road traffic apprehensions, legitimate manners in accommodating traffic disruptions, compliant behaviors on handling obstruction on normal traffic flow and other matters pertaining to traffic management. Almost 2100 Barangay Tanods received complete traffic gears such as vest, gloves and boots which they can use while performing their duties in their respective barangay. They were also given packs of rice. Local officials of the three LGUs including Carmona Mayor Roy Loyola and Vice Mayor Cesar Ines Jr., GMA Mayor Walter Echevaria and Vice Mayor Maricel Torres, and Silang Mayor Cory Poblete joined Governor Remulla showing their commitment and strong support to the undertaking on traffic management in the whole province. Fifth District Representative Dahlia Loyola and Board Members Ivey Jayne Reyes and Alston Kevin Anarna were also in attendance, together with some councilors from the three municipalities. --(PICAD)



MEDICAL AND DENTAL MISSION FOR DASMARIÑEÑOS: The Provincial Government of Cavite thru the Office of the Governor and Provincial Health Office continues to provide health care assistance to residents of the City of Dasmariñas during the medical and dental mission held at Cityhomes Resortville Covered court, Barangay Langkaan II on November 5, 2019. A total of 400 patients received free medical consultation and 33 locals underwent tooth extraction performed by the doctors and dentists from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital and trained staff from the Office of the Governor. Medicines and vitamins were also given to the patients. The barangay council headed by Punong Barangay Fernando T. Laudato lauded Governor Jonvic Remulla for his constant support to his constituents. BASIC SERVICES CARAVAN FOR RELOCATED FAMILIES IN MARAGONDON

The Provincial Government of Cavite, thru the leadership of Governor Jonvic Remulla, in collaboration with the Department of the Interior and Local Government headed by OIC Provincial Director Eloisa Rozul, conducted a free basic services caravan on November 4, 2019 at Barangay Sta. Mercedes Multi-purpose hall and open grounds.

Updates from the peace and order and anti-drug abuse council meeting last September 26, 2019 facilitated by the Provincial Planning and Development Office gave emphasis on sustaining the delivery basic services in vulnerable areas to thwart the infiltration of terrorist armed groups. This gave way to the pooling of initiative and resources of various agencies for the delivery of services to affected families living in the identified geographically disadvantaged communities.

Maragondon Mayor Reynaldo Rillo who has been lauded by DILG for his proactive stance towards issues of infiltration by undesirable groups to vulnerable communities in Barangay Patungan and Pinagsanhan, made his rounds to constituents during the caravan. Mayor Rillo expressed his appreciation to Governor Remulla for the nonstop support and took the opportunity to thank all the volunteers who

contributed to the success of the outreach program.

Medical, dental and technical volunteers from the Provincial Health Office (PHO) and the Philippine Medical Association-Cavite Chapter carried out health programs including consultation, tooth extraction, family planning, immunization and awareness campaign on dengue, non-communicable diseases and proper nutrition.

The BJMP Calabarzon Health Services Division headed by CINSIP Edna Leonor donated medicines while some of their officers and those of the PNP offered free haircut and performed dental extraction.

Aside from the free health-care services, giveaways such as slippers and backpacks from the Office of the Provincial Governor, emergency kits from the Provincial Disaster and Risk Reduction Management Office (PDRMO), and bath towels from DILG provided so much joy especially to the children. Some residents indulged in the free-of-charge beauty and wellness services offered by the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) such as manicure, pedicure, hair-cut and massage therapy.

Among other services that were highly appreciated by more than 700 locals were: assistance from the Municipal

Civil Registrar for PSA documents application; seeds/seedlings distribution by the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist (OPA); anti-rabies vaccination by the Office of the Provincial Veterinarian; livelihood training (dishwashing and liquid soap-making) and the feeding program from the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Entrepreneurial Development Office (PCLEDO), DTI-Cavite and Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO); Philhealth Membership/Enrolment; and the advocacy program for teenagers by the Provincial Population Office.

Over-all coordination for the simultaneous conduct of activities was led by the OPG-Extension Medical and Dental Mission Team headed by Ms. Maribel Bernal together with PGC department heads of partner offices. Ms. Bernal, along with doctors from PHO led the donation of some supplies of medicines to the Punong Barangay of Pinagsanhan.

Other volunteers in attendance were personnel from the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) with their Drug Abuse Prevention and Education (DAPE) comics to help raise the public's awareness on the harmful effects of illegal drugs and how to prevent their abuse through images combined with texts.--PICAD
