Sa United States alam nyo bang marami ng kaso ng pagkakasakit dahil sa paggamit ng e-cigarettes. Ayon sa US Centers for Dis- ease Control and Prevention (CDC), naitala ang 2,172 kaso ng pagkasira ng бага at 42 ang namatay dahil sa pag gamit ng vape. Batay pa sa isang pag-aaral, mayroon umano itong nicotine, metal sa puso. At sinisira umano ng e-cigarettes ang car- diovascular system ng isang tao. PH opens first e-passport renewal center in Dubai

**MANILA** -- The Depart- ment of Foreign Affairs (DFA) has inked a memo- randum of understanding with VFS Global in Dubai for the establishment of the first Philippine Passport Re- newal Center (PaRC) abroad. DFA Undersecretary Brigido Dulay and VFS Glo- bal head of business devel- opment, Chris Dix, signed the document at the Wafi Mall in Dubai on November 21, in the presence of For- eign Secretary Teodoro Loc- sin Jr. and VFS Global Re- gional Group Chief Opera- tions Officer Vinay Malhotra. The signing was fol- lowed by the inauguration of the PaRC at the Dubai Health Care City. According to the DFA's release on Friday, this is the first time that the Philippine government has out- sourced part of its passport renewal service to a private entity. The PaRC will provide an alternative means for Fil- ipinos to avail of passport renewal services in two of the Middle Eastern coun- tries with the highest con- centration of Filipino work- ers — the United Arab Emi- rates and Saudi Arabia. The latest data from the

DFA showed that about 600,000 Filipinos are resid- ing in the UAE, which makes it the second-largest concentration of Filipino workers in the Middle East. The launch of PaRC in Dubai will allow Filipinos in the area and the Northern Emirates to choose be- tween applying for the re- newal of their passport at the Philippine Consulate General in Dubai or the Center. Those who avail of the services at PaRC will pay an additional convenience fee on top of the normal cost of passport renewal pay- ment at the Consulate Gen- eral or the Philippine Em- bassy in Abu Dhabi. PaRC will only cater to simple passport renewal services that do not require any changes in the bio- graphic details of the pass- port holder. The outsourcing to VFS Global only applies to the frontline operation of pass- port renewal, such as the acceptance of the applica- tion, capturing of biometrics and biographical details, payment of fees, and re- lease of passport. The ac- tual production of the pass- port is still with the DFA. In his remarks, Locsin

said the opening of PaRC was in response to Presi- dent Rodrigo Duterte's call to all government agencies to improve their services to the public, especially to Fil- ipinos overseas. Meanwhile, VFS' Mal- hotra thanked the depart- ment for partnering with them. “Our Passport and Con- sular services have been growing from strength to strength, and we look for- ward to bringing the best in class services to the Philip- pines expats here in Dubai,” he said. DFA said similar cen- ters will be opened in the UAE capital of Abu Dhabi, as well as in Riyadh and Jeddah in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in 2020. (PNA)

**MANILA** — Malacañang on Friday was thankful that the crew and passengers of local flag carrier Philip- pine Airlines’ (PAL) Boeing 777 plane are safe follow- ing an emergency landing at the Los Angeles Interna- tional Airport. A PAL Flight 113 on its way to Manila made an emergency landing after
